The original museum is located near Lake Michigan. The **John Michael Kohler Arts Center** offers rotating exhibitions featuring contemporary artists. Numerous artistic mediums are on display. Museum guides provide entertaining and informative walking tours through eight galleries. Known for having the top washrooms in the country, the Arts Center features six awardwinning artist-commissioned facilities. Outdoor gardens feature scenic paths and sculptures. Enhance the tour experience with shopping in the gift shop, dining at the onsite café, and crafting hands-on art projects in the studio.

Opened in 2021, the **Art Preserve** is a few miles west of the Arts Center. It hosts the first and only collection of artistbuilt environments in the world. Discover fascinating largescale works of art that invite exploring who we are and our relationship to the spaces we occupy. Visitors enter the Art Preserve through a "forest" of soaring timbers. Inside, they will find intriguing, multifaceted works of art by more than thirtyfive artists who transformed homes, yards, and other spaces. Winner of the 2022 American Architecture Award.
